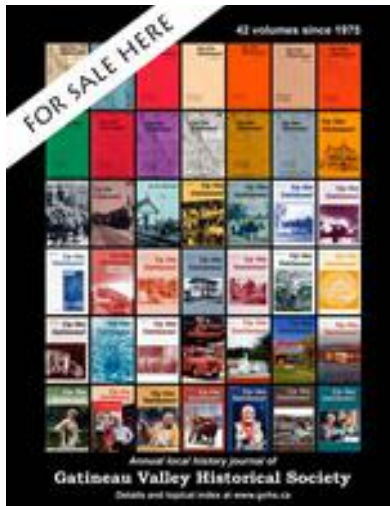

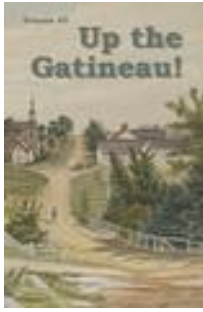

Released in May 2017; a diverse collection of 9 articles and 1 poem, this volume features 4 first-time and 4 returning contributors.

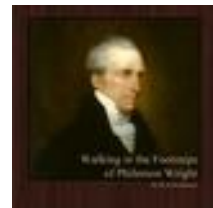

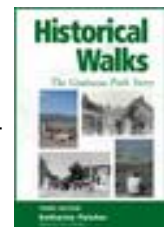

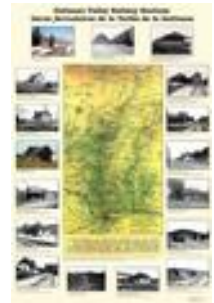
