2.2.4 HERITAGE - VALUE THE HERITAGE RELATED TO THE CAPITAL

Gatineau Park features cultural landscapes, archaeological resources, and an architectural heritage of local, regional and national importance. It contributes to the NCC's mission by publicizing the value and beauty of these cultural landscapes, archaeological resources, and architectural heritage among all Canadians. Over the years, the NCC has enhanced some notable heritage elements and must now broaden these initiatives. The following objectives have been established:

HERITAGE WEALTH

1. Enhance the cultural landscapes, archaeological resources and architectural heritage that fulfill the Park's conservation, interpretation and communications functions.
2. Create a cultural recreational experience using historic symbols to be enhanced, such as the agricultural landscapes in the Meech Creek valley.
3. Direct interpretation message towards the conservation of cultural landscapes, archaeological resources and architectural heritage, and towards public education.
4. Create and enhance view corridors - for example, along Parkways - to allow for the interpretation and observation of cultural landscapes, and establish links between the Capital's built environment and the natural areas of the Park

CONSERVATION PLAN

5. Prepare conservation plans for the Park's cultural landscapes, archaeological resources, and architectural heritage that will allow for both conservation and the development of a rich and varied cultural experience.
6. Ensure restoration and maintenance of the Park's designated symbols, according to their historical importance (Mackenzie King Estate, Meech Creek Valley, Carbide Wilson ruins, farms, parkways, etc.).

7. Preserve the Park's political function by maintaining the official residences that form part of the capital's significant architectural heritage and bear witness to Canada's political
