THE ULTIMATE IN SPECIAL DELIVERY by Norma Geggie

The train service from Ottawa to Maniwaki from the late 1800s offered a wonderful service to the people of the Gatineau. However, it appears that a service was also offered in the opposite direction.

Hector Vaillancourt recently supplied the Gatineau Valley Historical Society image bank with many pictures which have greatly enhanced our collection. One picture, possibly taken in the 1950s, and reproduced on page 3 of this newsletter, required a little explanation.

Elmer Wills, who ran an ice cream parlour in Wakefield in the building that now houses the National Bank, provided an exceptional service to the crew in the engine. As the train approached the centre of the village on the return trip to Ottawa, it slowed sufficiently for Elmer to delivery two Cokes to the two men.

Then the next morning he would find on the lawn of his house which was opposite the ice cream parlour, (now Dr. Chicoine's residence and office) the empty bottles with dimes inside in payment.

The building seen in the background of the photo was then owned by Mr. Alex Austin, and was home to the Post Office, with Bernard Sully acting as postmaster. It will be recognised today by its outline as Khewa, the native art boutique in Wakefield.
