
"The Halifax Explosion: The Untold Story of Canada's Worst Disaster"

Just over one hundred years ago, on December 6, 1917, a French munitions ship and a Norwegian war relief vessel collided in the harbour at Halifax, Nova Scotia. The accident sparked a fire and an apocalyptic explosion which levelled half the city, killed 2,000 people, and injured 9,000 more.

Ken Cuthbertson recounts the untold story of Canada's worst disaster. It's a haunting tale that in many ways is uniquely Canadian. It's also a cautionary tale that all Canadians should know.

Kingston-based author-editor Ken Cuthbertson has more than 35 years' experience writing for newspapers and magazines in Canada, the U.S. and the U.K and is the former editor for the Queen's Alumni Review magazine. His latest publication is The Halifax Explosion: Canada's Greatest Disaster.

Guest Speaker **Danielle Siemens** of the Art Gallery of Alberta in Edmonton will be our featured after-dinner speaker. She will give us a brief preview of her research on Canadian photographer and amateur field-naturalist Rosemary Gilliat Eaton (1919-2004). Gilliat Eaton lived in Ottawa for about a decade in the 1950s and '60s and rented Shilly Shally cabin in Gatineau Park during that period, documenting the comings and goings at her cabin, in photographs and journals.

The Wright Papers are a collection of over 600 documents held by David F. Wright of Chelsea, Quebec.

They are concerned primarily with the business affairs of Philemon Wright (1760-1839) and his son Ruggles (1793-1863) and include original land transfer records, court documents, letters, ledgers, wills, family correspondence, and many other related records.

The digitization of these documents and catalogues was done in 2015-2016. The GVHS wishes to acknowledge the dedicated effort of Society members Erik Rask, Stephen Adcock, Suzanne Gibeault, and the late Pat Evans for realizing this mammoth project, and we are thankful to David F. Wright for lending the material to the Society to digitize.
