Only a horse stable




And nobody cut the grass

Before the road was built everything came by water or horse and wagon if the road through the swamp was frozen









Duke and our other sled dog in front of our cabin in the winter of 1949. I'm standing on the sled with Tohn and Claude Lapierre behind me.































Harrison, Grace (nee Cannon)
